

## Food Establishment Inspections



Food establishment inspections follow New Jersey law (Chapter 24, N.J.A.C. 8:24). Each inspection generates a rating, with a satisfactory, conditional, or unsatisfactory result. If an unsatisfactory rating is determined, the restaurant is closed (there were no unsatisfactory results in 2008). When food establishments receive a “conditional” report, a re-inspection must occur.

In order to promote excellence in food handlers, the Bergen County Gold Star Program continued in Lyndhurst for its second year. Lyndhurst Burger King and Polito Avenue Subway received this award in 2007 and 2008. Two other recipients received the award in 2008: Restaurant Associates at Sony and Deli in the Park

### Re-inspection Fees

As of January 1, 2009, if your food establishment receives a “conditional” rating on routine inspection:

1. You will be required to pay a re-inspection fee of \$200.
2. The re-inspection fee must be paid at the Registrar’s Office in the Health Department prior to re-inspection.
3. The health inspector shall determine the time period allowed before re-inspection, with a maximum time allowed of two (2) weeks.
4. If the re-inspection fee is not paid within two (2) weeks, a summons will be issued with a fine of \$500-\$1,000.

All licenses expire on December 31, 2009.
