 **Winter Storm Advisory**

The Township is closely monitoring an anticipated winter storm expected to impact Bergen County beginning early Sunday morning and continuing through Monday.

According to the National Weather Service, snow is expected to begin in the early morning hours on Sunday, with the heaviest snowfall occurring Sunday afternoon through Sunday evening. Current forecasts call for **6–10 inches of snow**, with locally higher amounts possible. Snowfall rates may reach **1–2 inches per hour**, resulting in reduced visibility and hazardous conditions.

Daytime temperatures on Sunday and Monday will be in the low to mid-20s, with overnight temperatures dropping into the teens and single digits. Wind chill values may fall to near or below zero. Winds are expected to be 10–15 mph. **The Monday morning commute is expected to be slippery and hazardous** — please use caution while traveling.

Our Township departments are preparing for this storm, and snow removal operations will be ongoing as conditions require. Residents and business owners are reminded to comply with all local snow and safety regulations, including sidewalk clearing requirements within **48 hours** after the storm has ended.

**Parking Notice:**

To allow crews to safely and efficiently complete snow removal operations, residents are reminded to follow posted parking regulations during and after snow operations. Vehicles should be removed from roadways as directed to assist with plowing and cleanup. Updates regarding parking restrictions or post-storm parking will be communicated through official Township Office of Emergency Management.

Please stay informed by monitoring updates through the Township's OEM app, which will provide the most current information regarding weather conditions, snow operations, parking advisories, and safety notices.

Additional updates will be posted as conditions develop. Thank you for helping keep our community safe and accessible. Please stay safe.
